


Transformation – Urban Opportunities – Climate Change (TURbOCLiC)

We are part of GIZ’s innovative knowledge management tools called sector networks. Two important networks are the TUEWAS (Transport, Environment, Energy and Water in Asia) and SNGA (Governance in Asia).

As a cross-sectoral group within these two networks, we are working mainly on the topics of urban governance, low carbon development, energy efficiency in buildings, urban resilience, inclusive cities, localizing SDGs, vertical governance integration, urban nexus, metropolitan governance, climate finance decentralized, capacity development, among others.

Created in 2013, pioneers have been the TUEWAS Cities and Climate Change and the SNGA Urban Opportunities working groups, who have been fruitfully cooperating since 2009. Several bilateral and regional programs are represented in the working group.


Our main goals are networking, knowledge management, including joint learning among programs, regional and technical exchange with national and international partners, strengthen the technical and advisory capacities of GIZ staff and partner experts, and work on developing innovative products. We interact through different channels, such as virtual and face-to-face meetings, newsletters, online platform, and innovative subject related webinars.



TURbOCLiC Webinar Series

In 2015 TURbOCLiC has initiated a webinar series, aiming at exchanging experiences / good practices among our members as well as other interested colleagues, partners and collaborators. An additional goal is also to systematically collect information about the relevant topics within our programs.

Around 200 colleagues have joined the webinars so far, not only from Asia, but also from Africa and Latin America, as well as Germany. Presentations were very informative and discussions interesting and fruitful. The webinar series has become a lively platform for interaction and networking. The series will be continued in 2018.
